Who can take Wood Badge?

Registered members of the BSA who have:

- Completed basic training for their Scouting position,
- Completed outdoor skills training for their Scouting position and
- Completed a current Annual Health and Medical Record form (available at www.scouting.org)

Wood Badge is most beneficial when it is taken early in a Scouter's career. The national council of the Boy Scouts of America recommends that all Scouters take this training within two years of registration.

What is WOOD BADGE?

It's all about Leadership! Wood Badge is an advanced training program for ALL Scouting leaders. It's designed for adults in Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting, Sea Scouting and Venturing, as well as district and council leaders and professionals.

When is it?

Sept 17-19 and Nov 5-7, 2016 (Saturday through Monday). Both weekends will commence at 8:00 AM on Saturday and will conclude by 5:00 PM on Monday.
